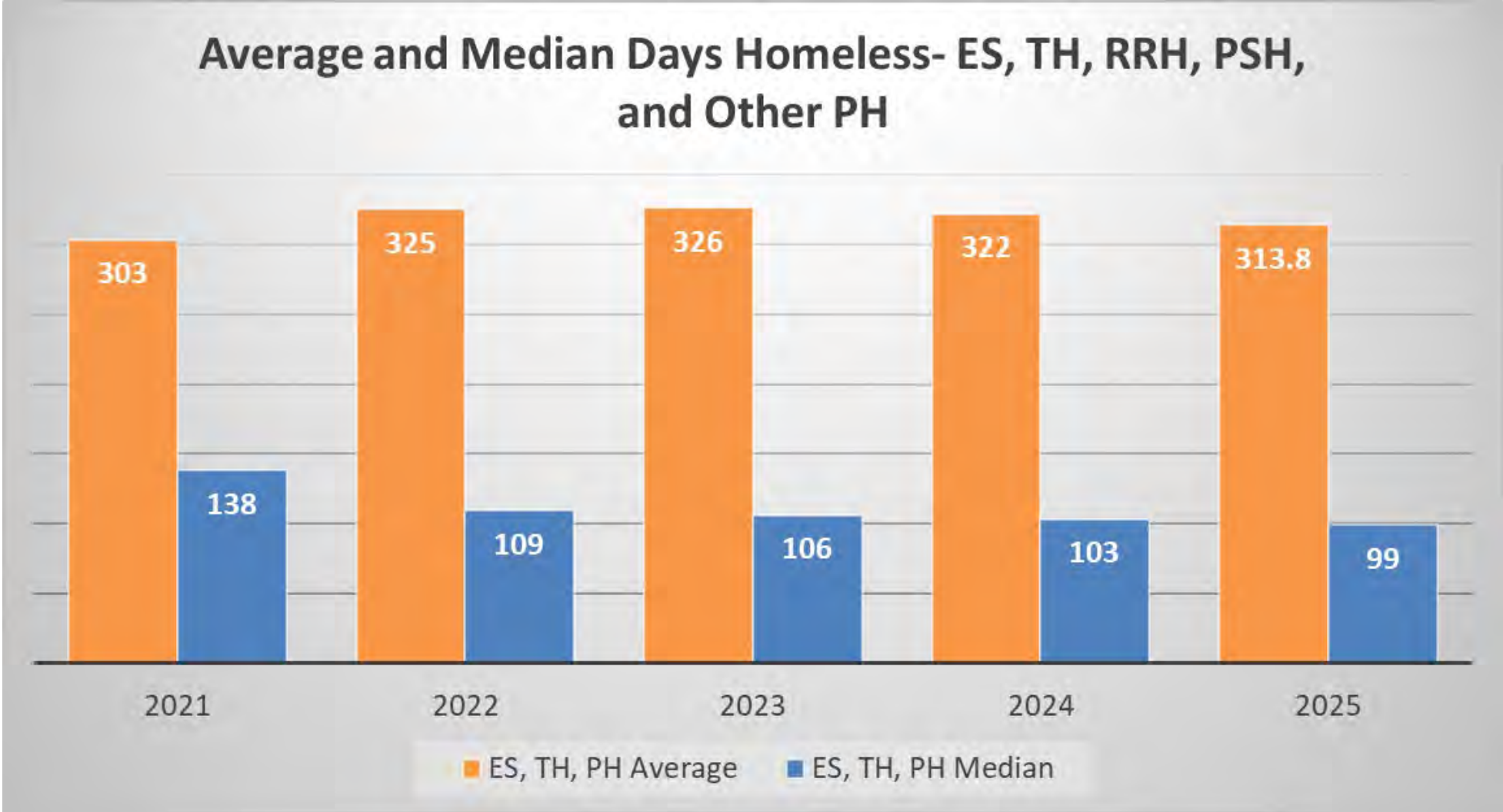

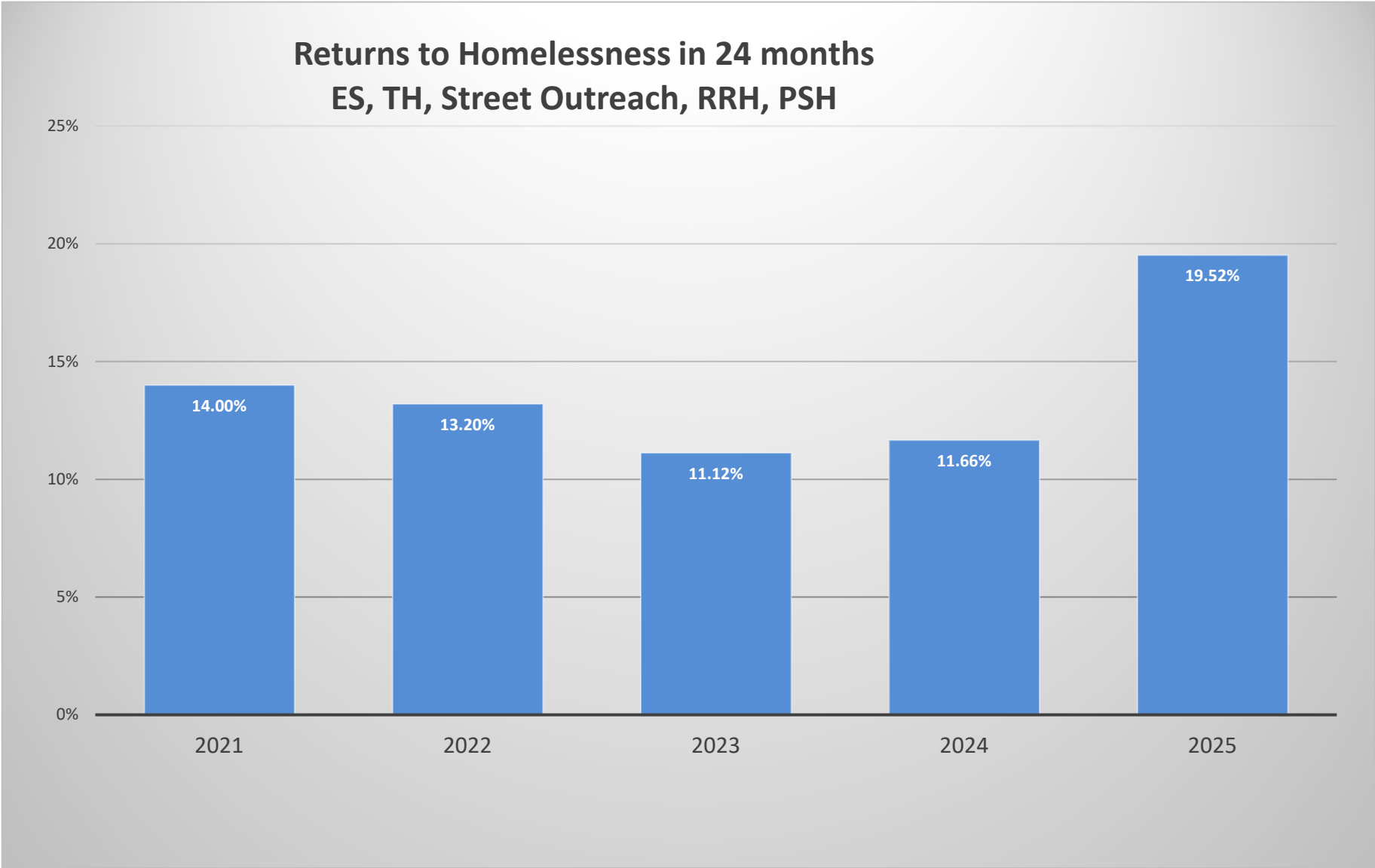

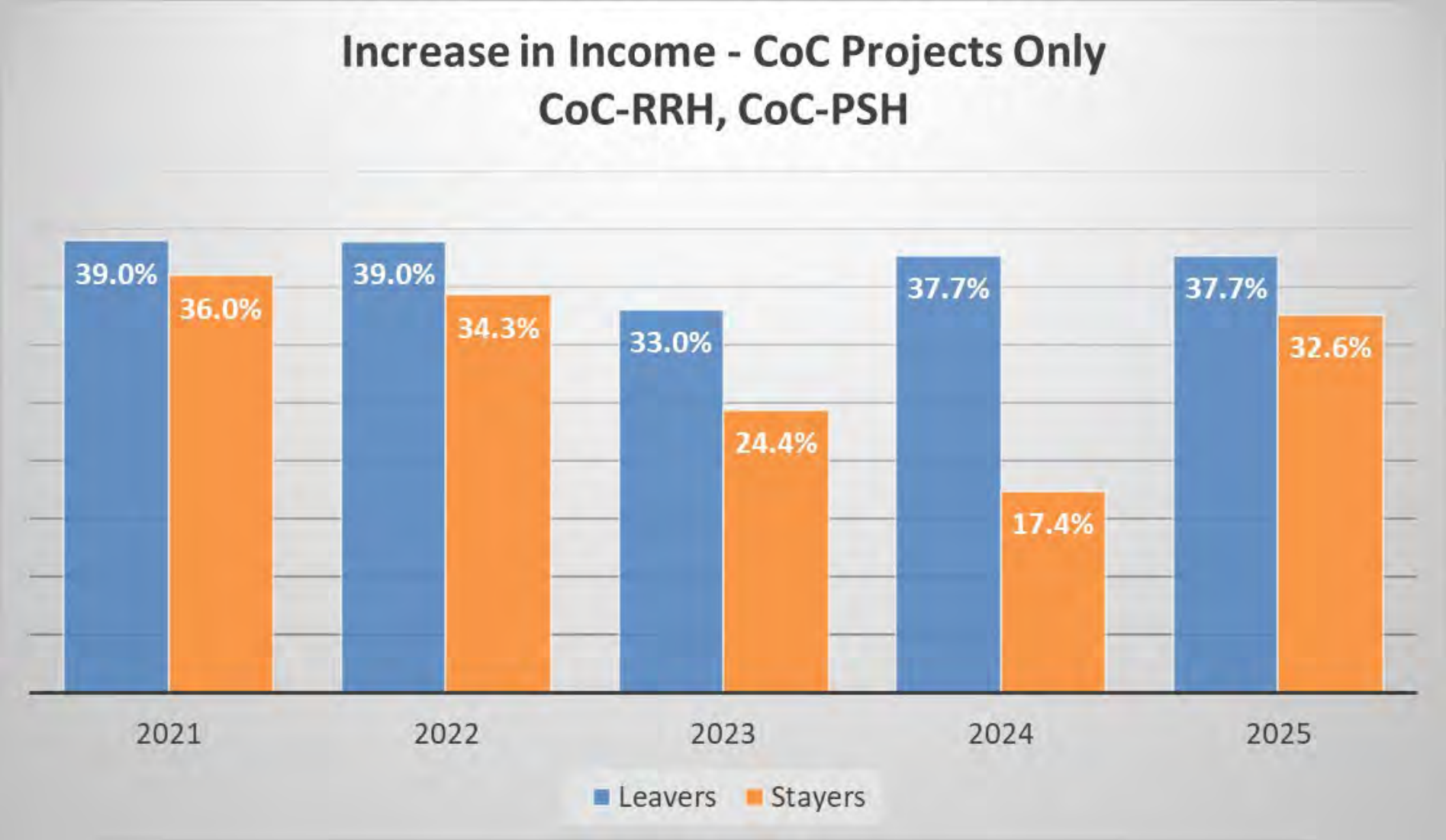
Measure 2: Returns to Homelessness



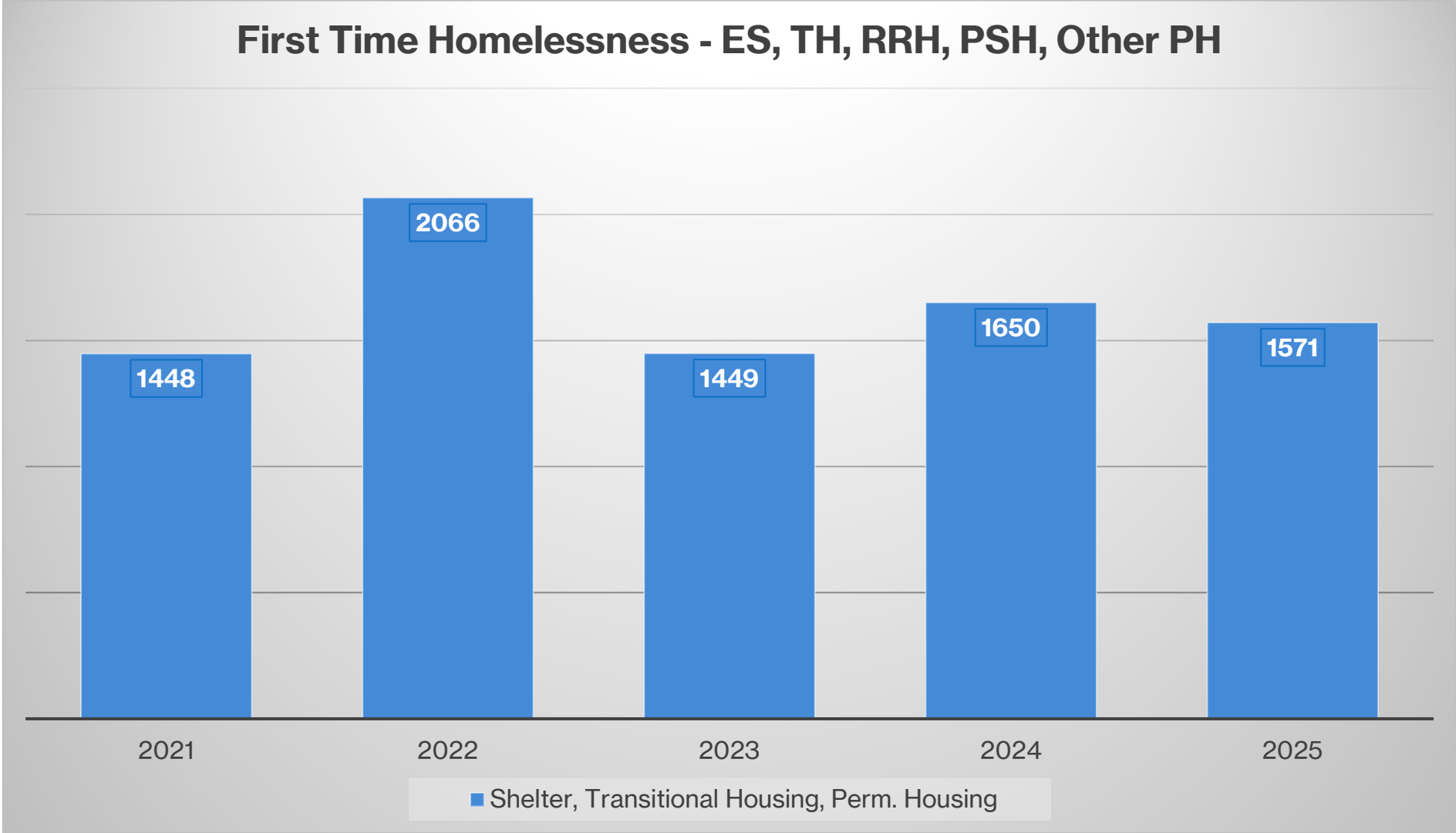

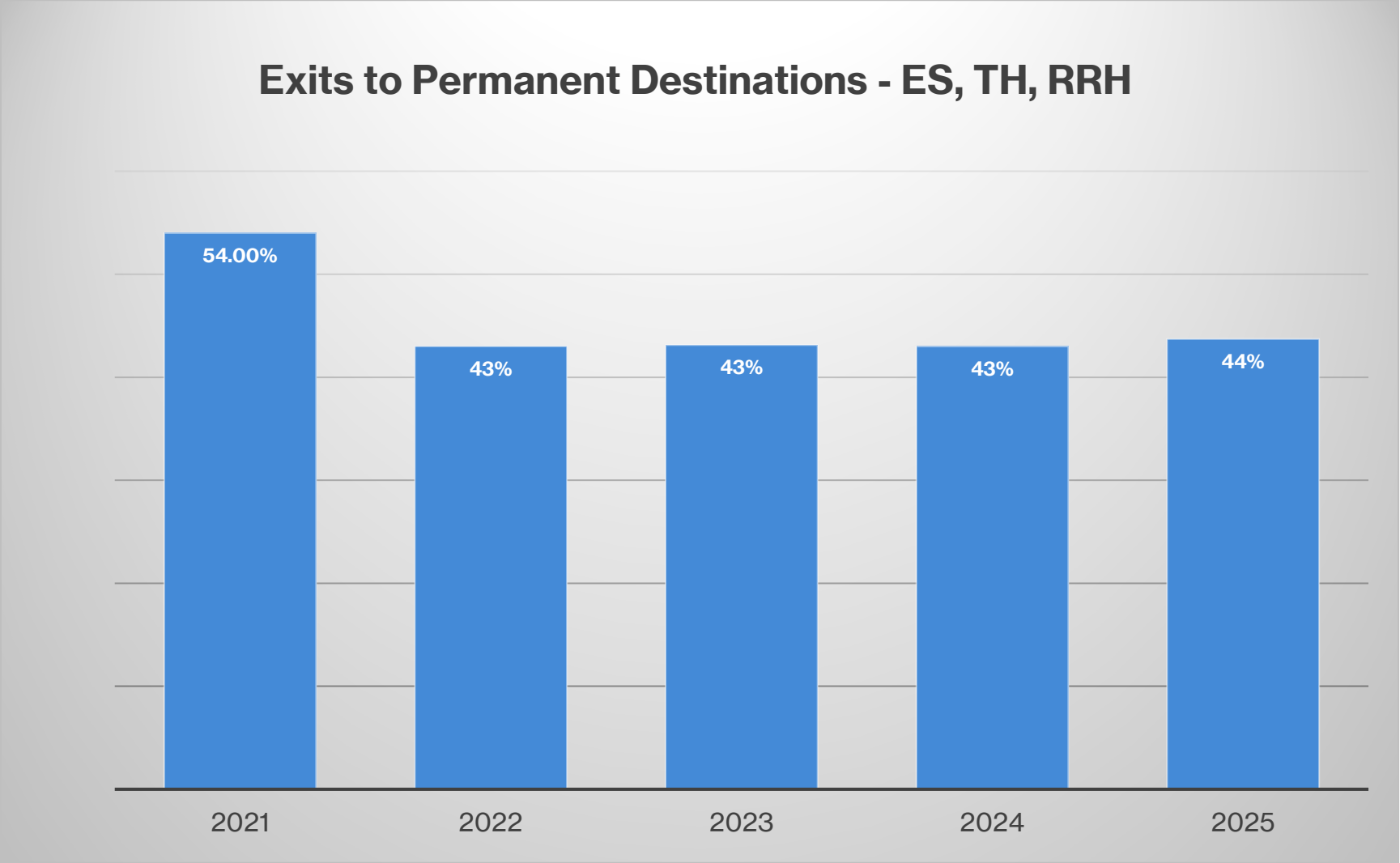

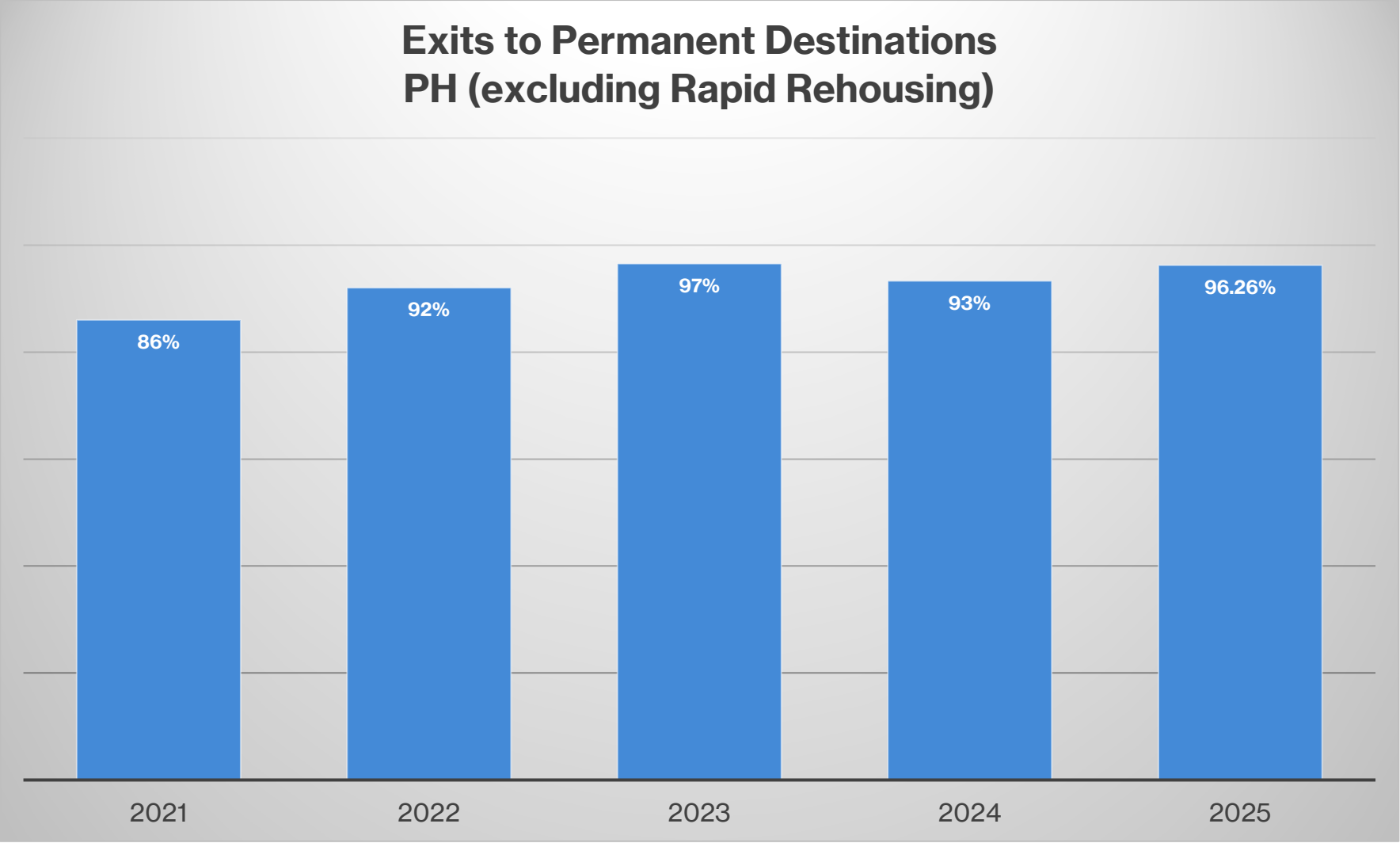

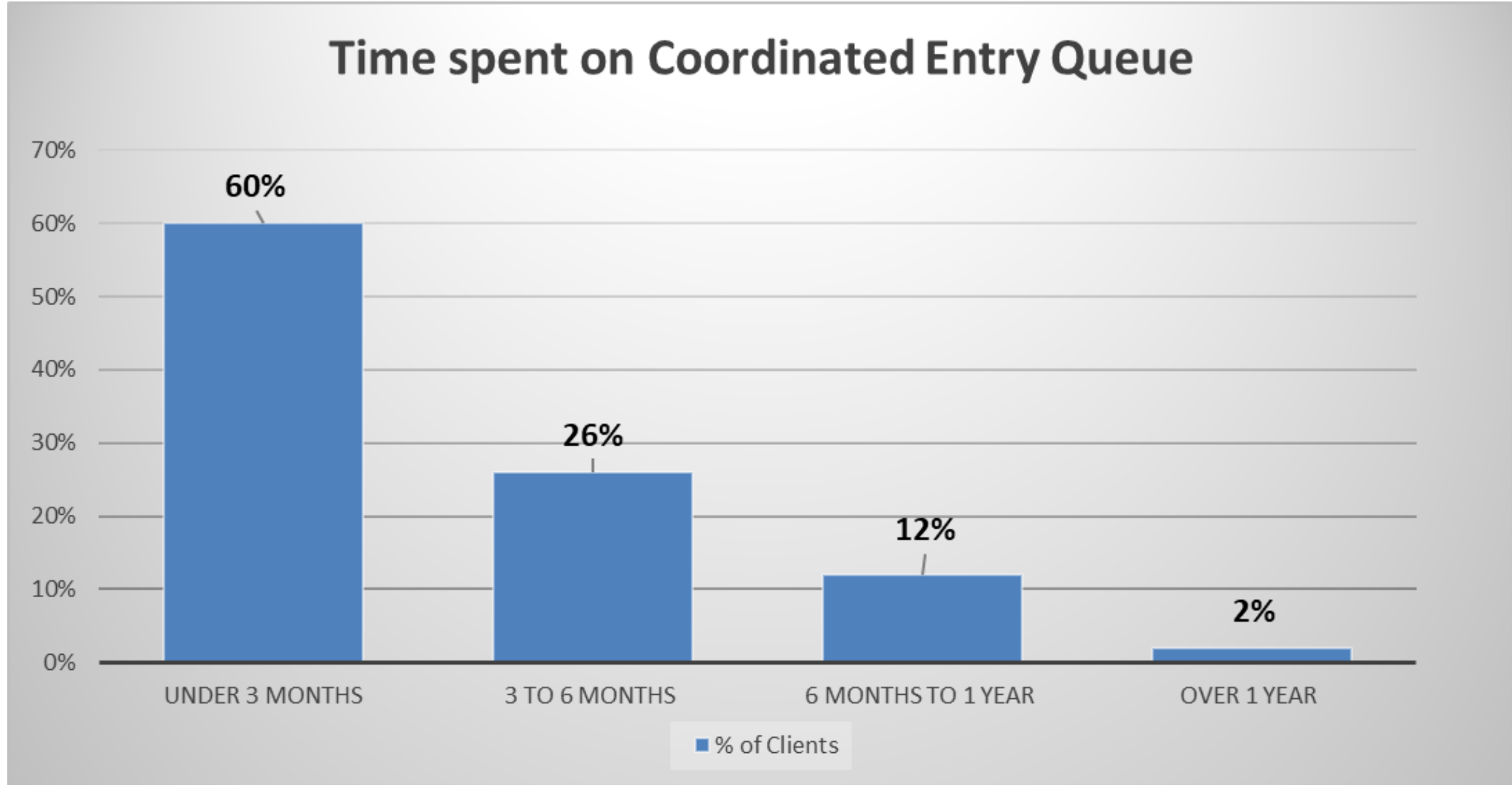


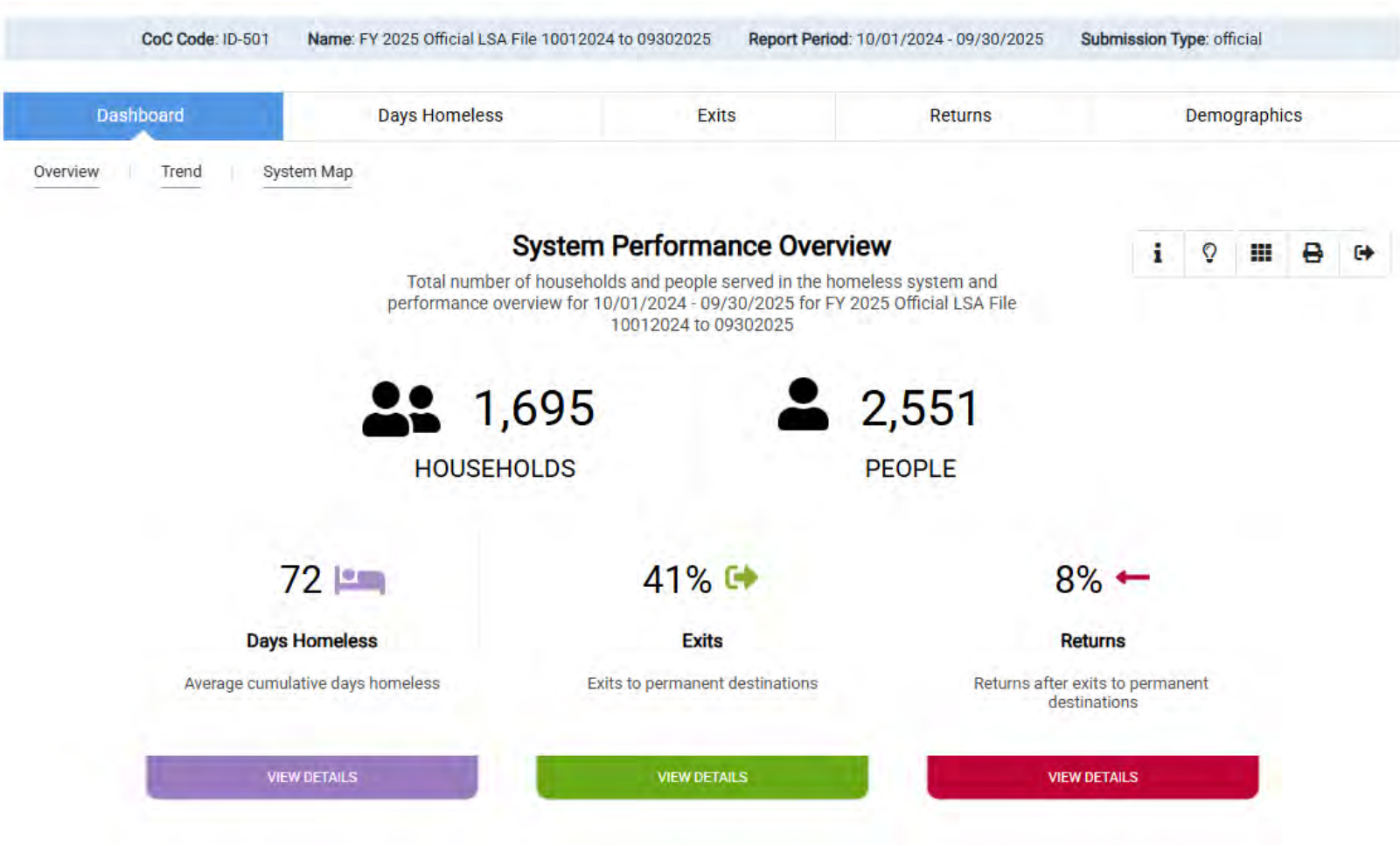

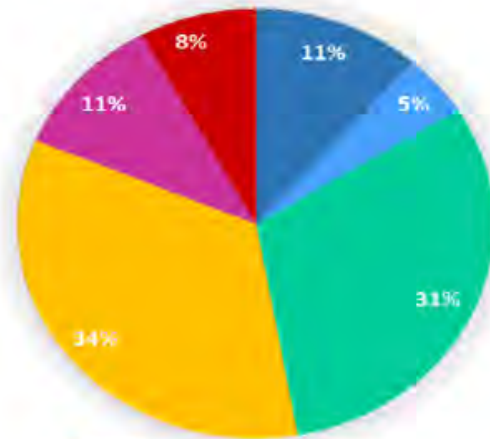

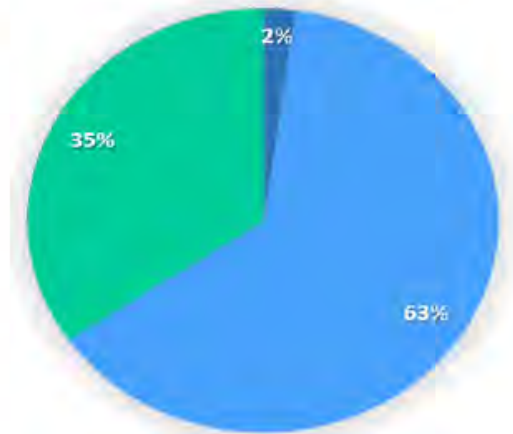

Homeless Prevention: Rent (6 months per year), services, and other financial assistance to those at-risk of homelessness.

Emergency Shelter: Temporary accommodations to avoid living on the street and connecting people to long term housing and services.

Rapid Rehousing: Rent (24 months in 3 year period), services, and other financial assistance to those with housing barriers and low service needs.

Permanent Supportive Housing: Long-term housing subsidies, assistance, and services for those with high service needs.
