HUD-CPD Region X Office determines the Maximum Subsidy Limits for Idaho. Idaho's maximum subsidy limits are calculated at 240% of the base limit for the Section 234 Program¹ The high-cost percentages listed in Notice CPD 15-003 for Boise and Portland continue apply throughout Idaho and Oregon.

Until a new rule is published, HUD issued [click here] <u>CPD Notice 15-003: Interim Policy on Maximum Per-Unit Subsidy Limits for the HOME Program</u>, the interim policy which uses the Section 234-Condominium Housing basic mortgage limits for elevator-type projects as an alternative to the Section 221(d)(3) limits. In order to determine the maximum amount of HOME funds a PJ may invest on a per-unit basis in HOME-assisted housing projects. This interim policy will remain in effect until the existing provisions of 24 CFR 92.250(a) are amended.
