IHFA Housing Roundtable Updates Spring 2026

The following is a summary document with updates on IHFA's affordable housing activities across Idaho.

Homelessness

Continuum of Care (CoC)

The Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) awarded ID-501 \$5,436,350 during the 2024 CoC Competition, which is \$1,385,418 more than the 2023 grant year. 2024 CoC grants had a start date of July 1, 2025, and will run until June 30, 2026. The distribution of CoC funding is typically 48% to Permanent Supportive Housing, 31% to Rapid Rehousing, and 7.6% to Supportive Services Only for the HIC Access Points. However, SSO increased slightly due to IHFA being awarded a CE DV Bonus grant for \$547,806. Additionally, the HIC approved of an amendment to increase the CE grant by an additional \$264,000.

CoC Planning grant funds support administration and initiatives like the Lived Experience Panel (LEP). The HIC hopes to expand to have at least one LEP in every region. Currently, panelists with lived experience of homelessness meet monthly to discuss the strategies, methods, and decisions taking place around the State to help solve homelessness.

Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG)

HUD awarded 2025 ESG funds to Idaho in the amount of \$1,141,854, which is \$26,078 more than last year. The 2025 ESG grant began on Oct. 1, 2025, and will run until Sept. 30, 2026. The distribution of ESG funding during the 2025 grant cycle will be approximately 45% to Shelter, 25% to Rapid Rehousing, and 25% to Homeless Prevention projects. IHFA has completed the comprehensive 5-year ESG plan called the Consolidated Plan which includes collaboration with HOME and CDBG funds. Youth Homelessness System Improvement (YHSI) Grant

HUD awarded \$368,545 through the Youth Homelessness System Improvement (YHSI) grant in June of 2024. The YHSI grant will support youth facing or at risk of homelessness by building capacity for Youth Action Boards and funding a statewide analysis on youth homelessness and the existing youth homelessness response system. The goal of the study is to gain insight into the socioeconomic and geographic factors contributing to youth homelessness as well as gaps in youth services.

The Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program (YHDP) Grant

HUD awarded \$3.8 million to the HIC, plus \$3.2 million to Ada Co. under the YHDP grant. The YHDP is guided by the Coordinated Community Plan (CCP). The YHDP will fund TH-RRH (about 82% of award), SSO-Outreach (about 9% of award), SSO-Host Home projects (about 3.4% of award), and two planning grants for IHFA administration and YAB support (about 5.6% of award). All applications have been reviewed, scored, and ranked. Funding recommendations were made to IHFA by the YAB. IHFA has extended tentative awards to five projects. YHDP projects started on March 1st, 2026 and will run for 28 months before being included as CoC renewal projects in the CoC competition. All YHDP subrecipients will provide one member on the statewide YAB and support the YAB with continual membership. If you have questions, please reach out to Itzel Chavez at itzelc@ihfa.org.

Rental Assistance

Housing Choice Voucher Program

Idaho Housing and Finance Association (IHFA) receives its funding for the Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) program from HUD. IHFA is not a federal department or agency. IHFA is a public housing agency (PHA) which is a governmental or public body, created and authorized by state law to develop and operate housing and housing programs for low-income families. IHFA enters into an Annual Contributions Contract (ACC) with HUD to administer the program requirements on behalf of HUD. IHFA's jurisdiction covers 34 of the 44 counties in Idaho, which are served by IHFA's four (4) branch offices located in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho Falls, Lewiston and Twin Falls). These counties are:

HOME

IHFA’s annual HOME allocation is approximately 5 million. As with last year, IHFA will be utilizing HOME funds for single family downpayment assistance as it evaluates other multifamily loan products with less administrative burden. HOME funds exist to create housing opportunities for households earning less than 80% of Area Median Income. This year, the HOME program and Family Self Sufficiency program are partnering to pilot a downpayment assistance program with rehabilitation. It is hopeful in late 2026, early 2027, HOME funds will be made available to assist income eligible homeowners with rehabilitation loans.

IHFA released its Permanent Supportive Housing RFP on May 15, 2025, and it was due August 15, 2025. \$14 million is being made available of both HOME and HOME ARP funding for the construction of housing. Additional supportive services and capacity building funds are being made available to support non-profits, who are the lead applicant.

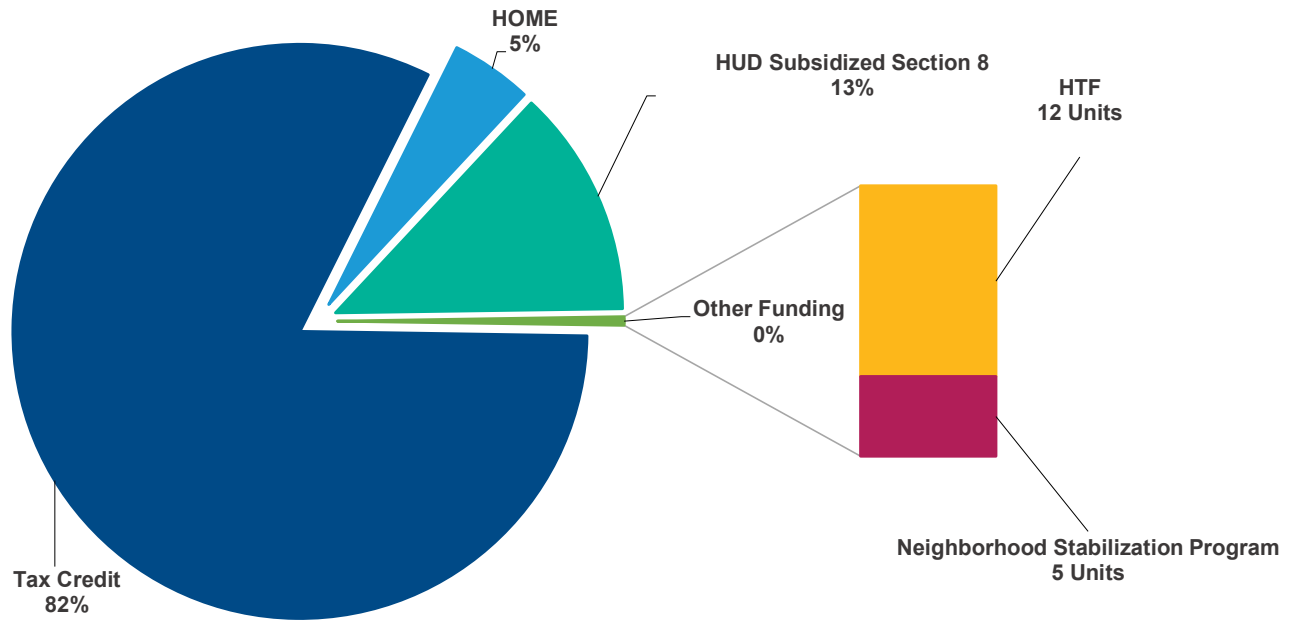
Region I Affordable Units by Program

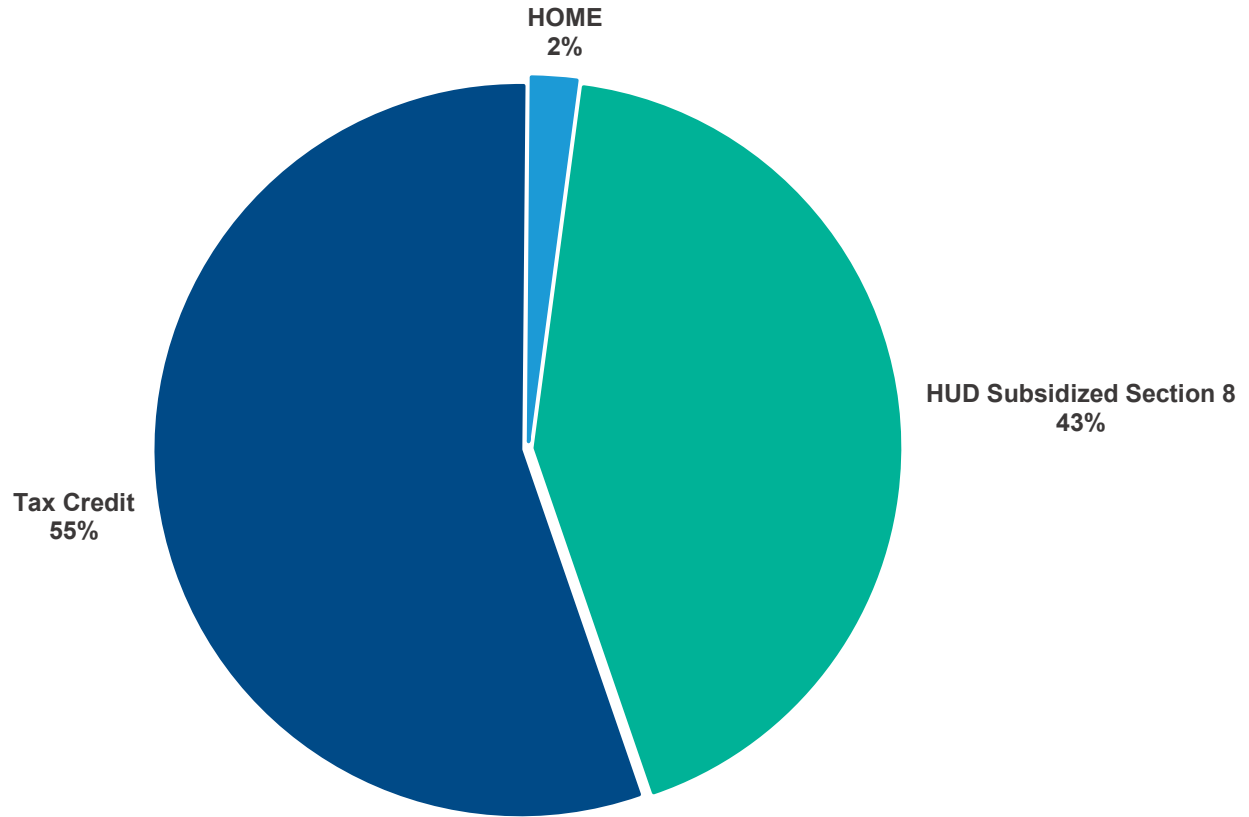

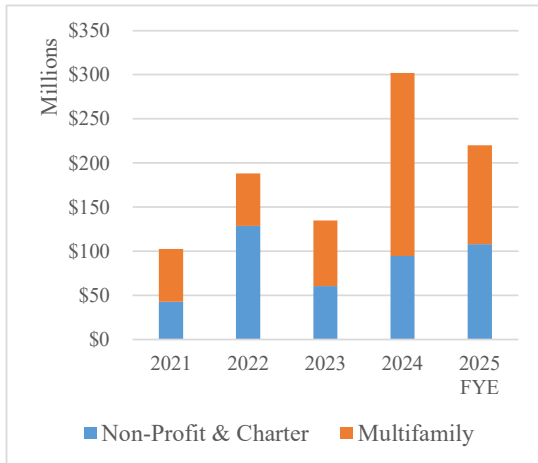

Nez Perce Tribal Housing Authority has 3 housing projects in progress or completion: a 5-unit tiny house village, a 10-unit Transitional Housing village, and a 20-unit development. Their hope is to move their encampment dwellers (about 25 people) into their newly developed spaces. In the near future they hope to partner with the HIC and others to build middle-income housing in Lapwai.
