- 1. Convene meeting/roll call.** Susan convened at 11:20am and took roll call.
- 2. Review & Finalize Minutes:** Bob motion to accept May 14, 2020 minutes as presented. Angela second. Meeting minutes passed.

**NEW ITEMS:**

**3. Regional Housing Coalition Updates**

- Region 1 – Bob reported they are closed, but available by appointment only- everyone wears masks. Envision Center- application coming through, it's a federal status not necessarily tied to funds. One stop shop. Also one in Spokane. Invites other community partners in. It's designed to be a broader service for the community.
- Region 2 – Angela reported no updates. Have not met with anyone or had any meetings due to current circumstances.
- Region 3 – Jeremy was not present but provided Susan with an update: He stated R3 met last month via Zoom, working on holding elections for offices. Hoping to have an in person meeting for elections. Lots of meetings via chat or over the phone given the circumstances.
- Region 4 – Not present on call.
- Region 5 – Susan said they are back in the office but still closed, doing everything via Zoom, phone. Their office is coming up with procedures for people coming into the office while wearing masks, just working on writing the policies. They are waiting for receptionist to return before they open. The access point has seen a large influx of people in need- they are literally homeless, not necessarily homeless prevention. Trying to do the best they can and get through. The shelter is closed, but still trying to get people housed. Having clients at hotels for precautionary measures. Have not met as a coalition yet- but hoping to meet soon.
- Region 6 – Not present on call.

**4. IHFA Updates:**

- Jenn mentioned the Housing Preservation funds thru IHFA- has a combination of funds through the Foundation, Wells Fargo, Micron, etc. They are able to serve people at risk for rent, utilities, etc. Currently 50% AMI, in talks of raising it to possibly 80% soon- doing three months payment at a time. The state has provided a big chunk of money for Homeless Prevention, which has much less restriction for who qualifies than ESG- keep sending people to the IHFA website to apply. If you have people waiting for unemployment- please send them to IHFA's website, this Housing Preservation pool of money is exactly who it's for- they are paying out rent and utilities for three months at this time.
